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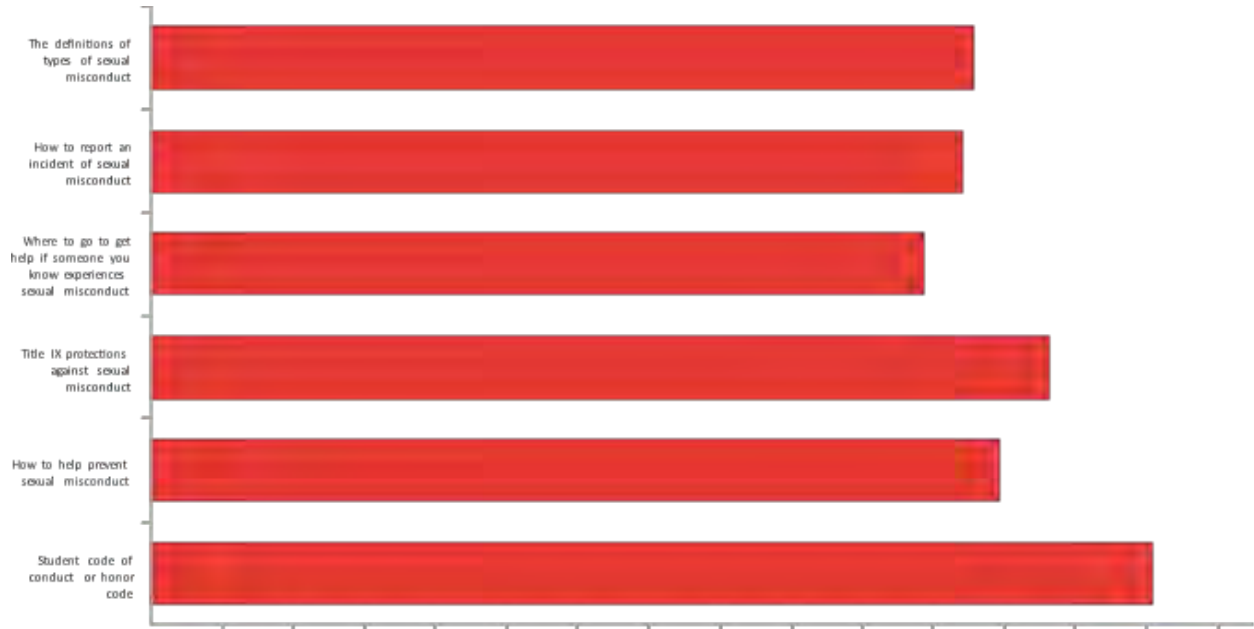
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The University of New Haven student experience survey was emailed to all undergraduate and graduate students. The University of New Haven sent an email to the student population notifying them of the opportunity to provide feedback and their experiences, which included a link to take the survey. When possible, the University of New Haven provided the class year, residency status, international student status, race/ethnicity, binary gender, and age of the participants.

There is no information provided to the University of New Haven that identified any student that completed this survey. Participants were informed that their responses were confidential and would not identify them, though their responses would be reported in this survey results. All survey questions were optional for participants.

No incentives were provided to participants for completing this survey.

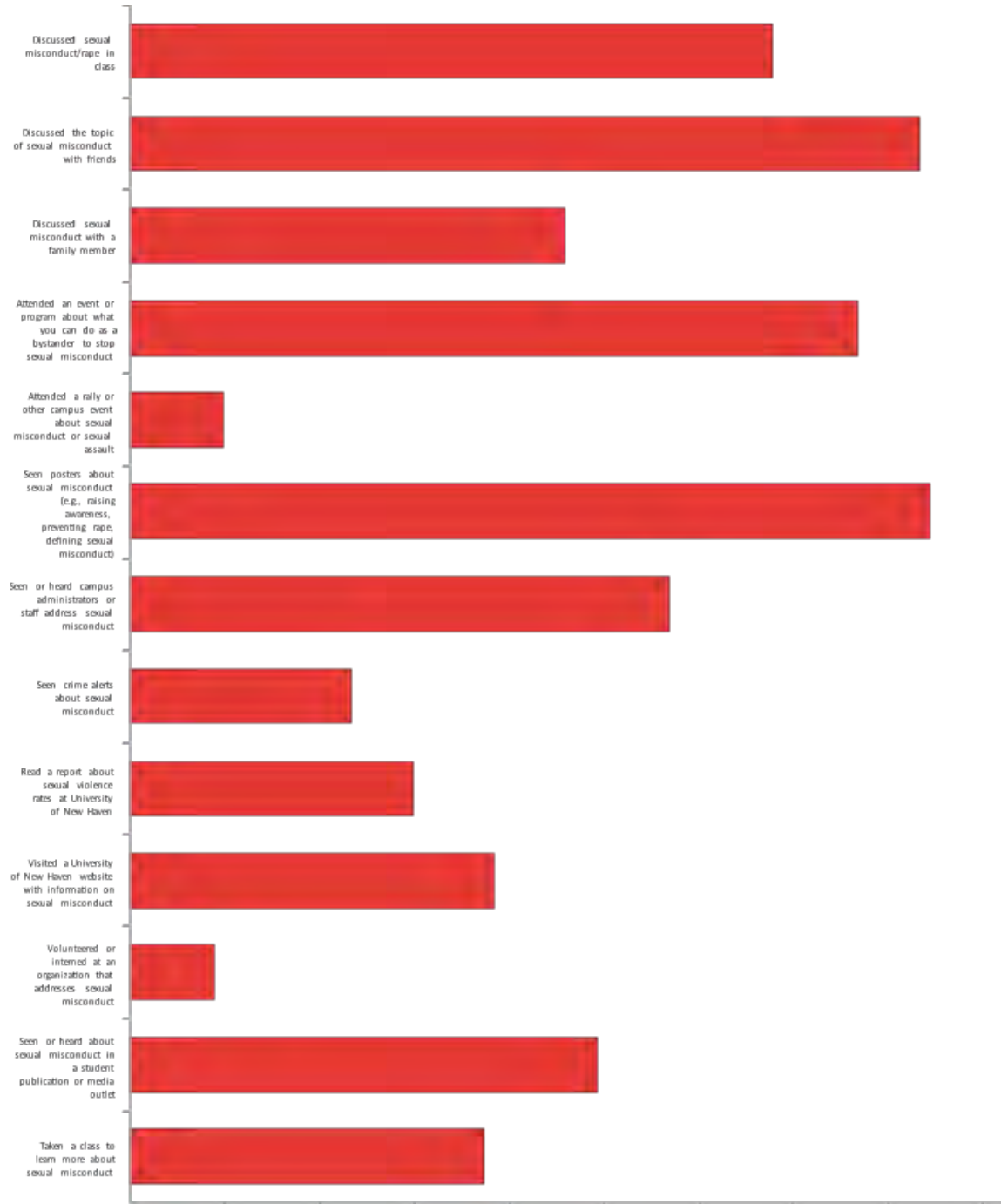

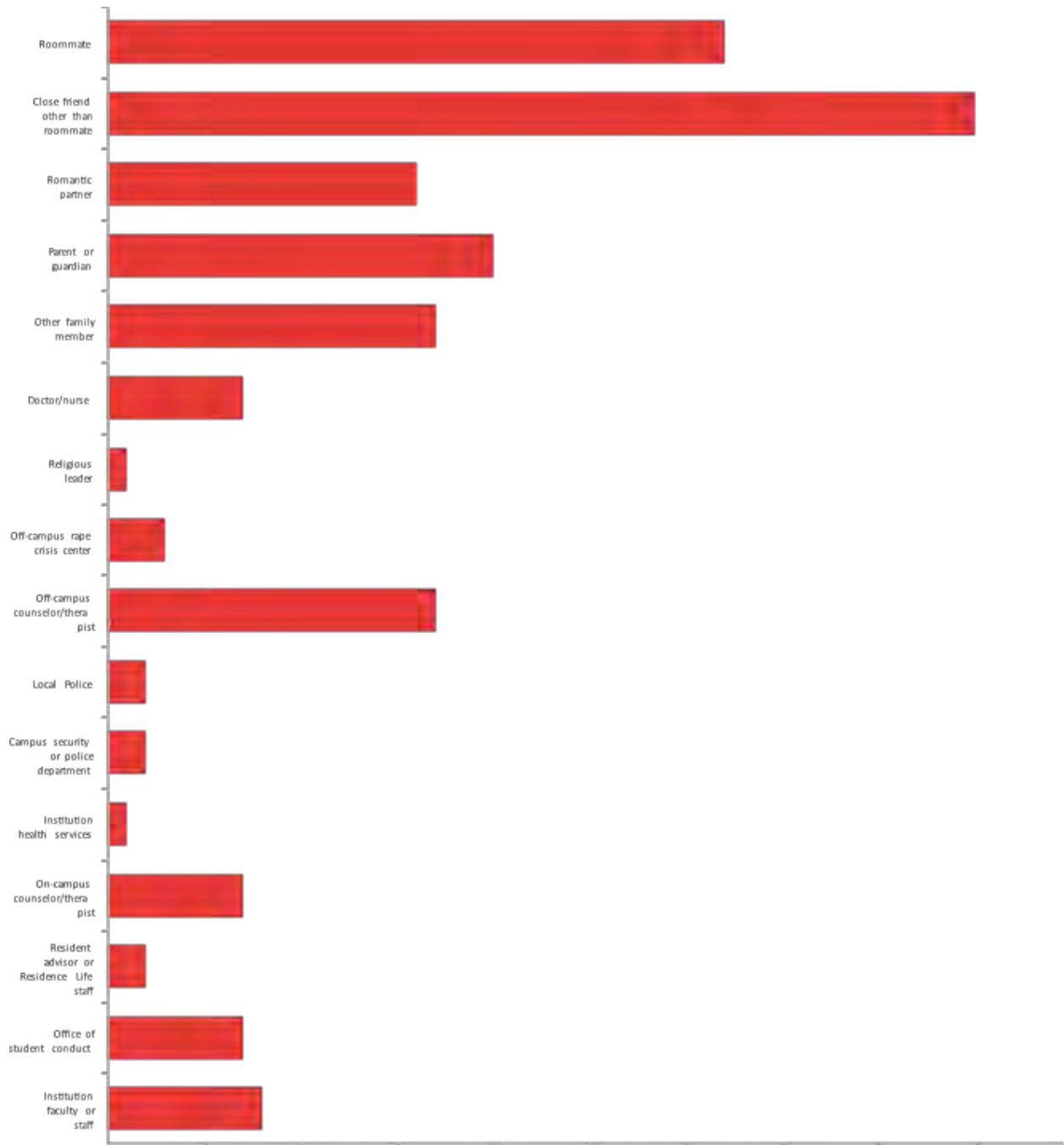

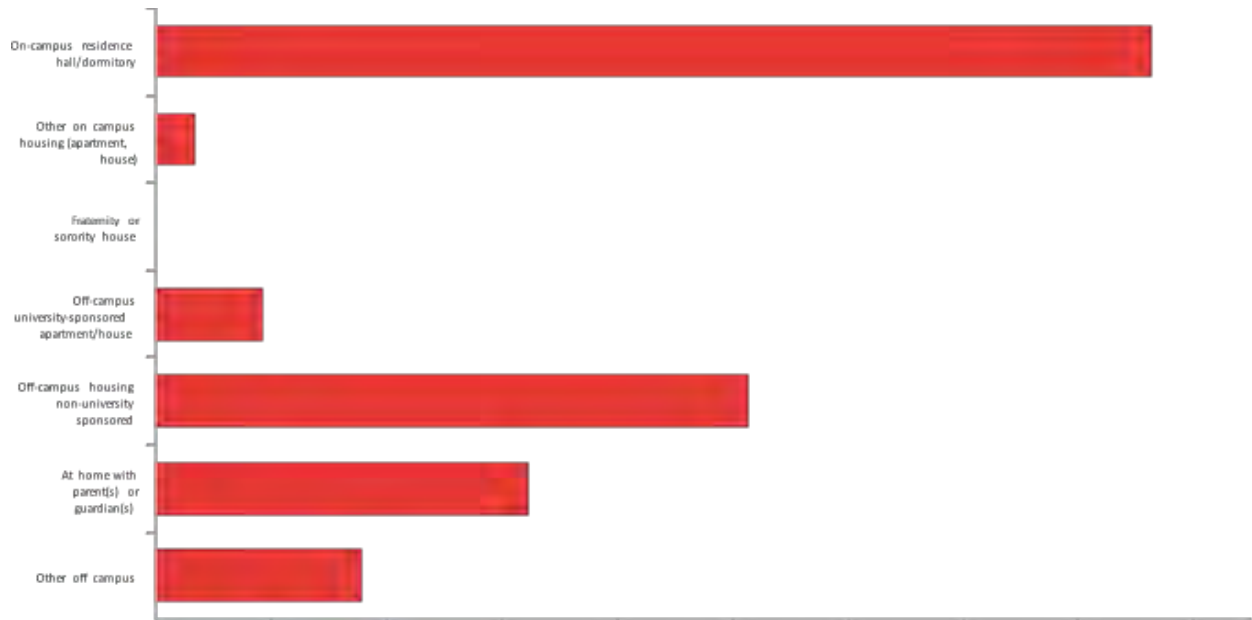
